RECOMMENDATION(S) TO COUNCIL

- 1. That Council notes the progress towards development of a master plan for the Cultural/Civic Precinct, which will be reported to Council upon completion, and upon which any future development discussions can be based.
- 2. That the Memorandum of Understanding Development is removed from the Council Work Schedule.

1. ISSUE

In August 2017 Council resolved as 137-17:

"That Council instructs the Chief Executive after due diligence to establish a Memorandum of Understanding with the Developer Group over a Hotel on the Council owned Church Street Carpark and explore potential linkages to the Conference and Function Centre, with a view to reporting back to Council in due course."

The report back is currently on the Council Work Schedule for March 2018.



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2. BACKGROUND

The City Future planning team are currently working on developing a master plan for the Cultural/Civic Precinct (the block as a whole between Church and Main Streets) to ensure that Council has a blueprint for future development of the block before committing to any particular development.

This approach will help ensure that Council is able to make the most of the opportunities that any development presents.

To report back to Council once the master plan work is finished.
