## Background:

Centrepoint Theatre is the only professional theatre company in regional New Zealand and the second oldest behind the Court Theatre in Christchurch. We have run a youth theatre company (The Basement Company) since 2005. The commitment required for performance which has been a large focus or, attendance to the weekly maintenance sessions paired with students needing to work, their current studies and extracurricular school activities have informed us that we need to re look at the structure of the programme we offer. The Basement Company began as an exclusive group of students that were put forward by the local high schools drama teachers to spend a year "in training" with Centrepoint Theatre. Over the years this evolved to being a paid programme making the course less accessible. We are proposing a different structure that will be a lot more inclusive, less taxing on the participants and offering maximum exposure to Industry experts for less commitment and pressure than a year long programme that we have found students do not have the time, energy or mental capacity for post covid. With the proposed new programme we can offer a variety of specialist areas to any young person who is interested, removing cost barriers and commitment restraints. Anyone can register for one or more workshops, they do not have to commit to the year programme.

We aim to bridge the gap between the professional world and the young people of Manawatu. We are working in the professional world on a daily basis. Staff at Centrepoint Theatre are Industry professionals with a vast network who have trained at leading establishments. We want to bring opportunities to our Rangatahi that they would otherwise not have. To be able to work with the best in an area that was once a pipe dream, this could be a life changing experience.

We engage the professionals, market the courses through our channels administering the registrations and, provide the venue and support staff for the workshops.

Students have the opportunity to build their own networks within the participants and also the tutors opening the possibility of further engagement with the visiting companies.

Workshops we have completed this year with the assistance of the Arts Heart Grant:

Four full day workshops -

Prop making with Weta Workshop designers \$800

Puppetry making and manipulation with Stringbean Puppets \$1300

Acting For Camera with two of NZ's top casting directors (Liz Mullane and Rachel Bullock) \$2500

Special effects makeup with WETA \$800

46 participants attended these workshops with 90% of the students having never been to Centrepoint Theatre before, or having been to anything like the workshops presented.





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Feedback from students who attended the three courses this year: I can not thank you enough Leona.


Poppy was buzzing when I picked her up and her mask is pride of place in her bedroom. I popped
